Behind the Brewstand: Lord Eoin's Ongoing Insights into SCA Mead Brewing

Greetings fellow gentles!

I was remiss last month in not posting my article to the Chronicler in time (she reminded me several times... I was very remiss...). So to make up for that, this month I'm going to cover two insight topics!

1.) Brewing Competitions!

Having finally managed to make and bottle at least three mead products (The straight mead, the Vikings Blood (with cherry juice) and the Bilbamel (with blueberry and vanilla)) I felt I was ready to test my mettle against those brewing greats (and amateurs) at a local event. As it turned out, Rip Rap War III was well suited for me because they wanted trios of products to be entered. So, with my labeled bottles I went to the event and had a wonderful time! Unfortunately I was missing something, but that I realized a bit later. I arrived right at the deadline for entering my mead, but no one seemed too fussed about holding that deadline. Still, best to get there on time is my motto! I placed my bottles down with their documentation which included basically the ingredients in each and the dates associated with their brewing and backsweetening and flavoring and bottling. Nothing more. And I waited.

It took a very long time. Right up and into the very beginning of court it seemed. I didn't win. *sad face* But then I didn't really expect to. Fortunately, after the competition is over and you pick up your entry, they provide you with a scoring sheet! So I got to see where I was lacking! Suffice it to say, I was very pleased with the clarity and most of the flavor and content scores. Where I failed was in my documentation. I had no documentation on the process I had followed (despite having written it down step by step when Lady Isabel Henry taught me) and I had no historical documentation on the various meads and mead types I provided. Oops! In discussing with some of the judges, and reviewing their marks, I found that my scores would have been significantly higher had I provided said documentation. Lord Bryan of the Priory even mentioned his documentation style sheet which I could find and use in the future as an example for making sure all my written "i's" were dotted and "t's" crossed.

All in all an informative and good day. Oh! And one other thing. Be sure to go early to pick up your entries. Paperwork can get shuffled and mixed up and according to the judges, my best entry of the three was my straight mead: and the scoring sheet on that one got lost (or wound up going home with another entrant) alas!

2.) Brewers Roundtables!

Having successfully entered my first competition, my next adventure in brewing led me to the Brewers Roundtable at Fall Coronation. Aside from the opportunity to sample many delicious brews, it provided me with the opportunity to meet fellow brewing enthusiasts within the kingdom and learn of different ways to do things. (One brewer I met makes mead in huge batches and uses a "cold" brewing approach! Who knew!) But perhaps the best was being able to bring a bottle of my mead (I brought the straight mead) and have other brewers sample it, comment on it, and just receive their casual insights into it. Many had things to say on the use of the clover and buckwheat honeys (leading to a "grassy or hay-like" hint in the mead). Most marveled at the clarity and color, citing the burnished glow that it had in the glass. If Competitions are good for giving you insight into the paperwork and structure, I highly recommend roundtables for getting tasteful opinions! Thanks for listening. I have two new batches being bottled this next month and look forward to having some at Yule!





Every Sunday, weather permitting, from 2 to 4pm rk in Chesterfield. The park is beautiful and the archery range is in the shade of the trees.


